5. SBSD agrees to provide all services billed to the Supportive Services Only (SSO) program in compliance with requirements set forth in Exhibit C- Continuum of Care Grant Agreement.

Summary statement of work Family Resource Navigator

The Family Resource Navigator will advocate for students and their families, coordinate services, provide ongoing feedback to the System of Care, and emphasize the importance of assisting youth and families dealing with complex needs. The Family Resource Navigator is responsible to identify, screen, coordinate, and provide a Service Plan for students receiving services through the program in partnership with school personnel, family members, community service providers, and others as identified by the students.

Additionally, the Family Resource Navigator will provide supportive services to the YHDP Supportive Services Only (SSO) clients in accordance to CoC Program Interim Rule, 24 CFR Part 578.53. These supportive services will include case management activities to YHDP SSO eligible students and disperse monthly food allowances to those clients while enrolled in the program.

The goal of the System of Care, Family Resource Navigator is to assist adolescents in managing challenges and barriers to success in school, family system and community. These barriers include: Family/Home Difficulties, Being Bullied, Academic Stress, Aggressive Behavior, Peer Relationship Issues, Substance Abuse, Self-Harm, Suicidal Ideation, other challenges the adolescent and/or family has identified as a barrier to success. The System of Care, Family Resource Navigator will do this by providing appropriate community referrals and following up with adolescent and/or family to track whether the referral was attended and beneficial. The project will provide a Navigator in South Bend school districts.

Contractor will provide data and participate in project evaluation as requested by Pacific County. This position will be funded based on a 190 school days per school year.

**CONTINUUM OF CARE PROGRAM (CDFA# 14.267)
GRANT AGREEMENT**

This Grant Agreement ("this Agreement") is made by and between the United States Department of Housing and Urban Development ("HUD") and Pacific County (the "Recipient").

This Agreement, the Recipient's use of funds provided under this Agreement (the "Grant" or "Grant Funds"), and the Recipient's operation of projects assisted with Grant Funds are governed by

1. The Consolidated Appropriations Act, 2022 (Pub. L. 117-103, approved March 15, 2022);
2. title IV of the McKinney-Vento Homeless Assistance Act 42 U.S.C. 11301 et seq. (the "Act");
3. the Notice of Funding Opportunity for the fiscal year in which the funds were awarded;
4. the following provisions of the Continuum of Care Program rule at 24 CFR part 578 (the "Rule"), as amended from time to time, except where they conflict with the requirements of the Fiscal Year 2022 Continuum of Care Competition and Noncompetitive Award of Youth Homeless Demonstration Program Renewal and Replacement Grants, the YHDP activities identified in the associated renewal or replacement YHDP project applications approved by HUD, or the requirement that grant funds may only be used to serve homeless youth, age 24 and younger: 24 CFR 578.3, 578.15, 578.23(a), 578.25, 578.27, 578.29, 578.37, 578.43, 578.45, 578.47, 578.49, 578.51, 578.53, 578.55, 578.57, 578.59, 578.61, 578.63, 578.73(c), 578.75, 578.77, 578.79, 578.81, 578.83, 578.85, 578.87, 578.89, 578.89, 578.91, 578.93, 578.95, 578.97, 578.99, 578.103(a)(3) - (18) and (b) - (e), 578.105, 578.107 and 578.109; and
5. the Recipient's application submissions on the basis of which these Grant Funds were approved by HUD, including the certifications, assurances, technical submission documents, and any information or documentation required to meet any grant award condition (collectively, the "Application").

The use of Grant Funds and the operation of these projects are also subject to the requirements of 2 CFR 200.306, as may be amended from time to time, with the exception of 200.306(b)(5).

The Application is incorporated herein as part of this Agreement, except that only the project (those projects) listed below are funded by this Agreement. In the event of any conflict between any

application provision and any provision contained in this Agreement, this Agreement shall control. Capitalized terms that are not defined in this agreement shall have the meanings given in the Rule.

HUD's total funding obligation authorized by this grant agreement is \$44,406, allocated between the projects listed below (each identified by a separate grant number) and, within those projects, between budget line items, as shown below. The Grant Funds an individual project will receive are as shown in the Application on the final HUD-approved Summary Budget for the project. Recipient shall use the Grant Funds provided for the projects listed below, during the budget period stated below.

The budget period and performance period of YHDP renewal and replacement projects funded by this Agreement will begin immediately at the end of the budget period and performance period of the grant being renewed or replaced. Eligible costs incurred between the end of Recipient's budget period and performance period under the grant being renewed or replaced and the date this Agreement is executed by both parties may be reimbursed with Grants Funds from this Agreement. No Grant Funds for YHDP renewal or replacement projects may be drawn down by Recipient before the end date of the project's budget period and performance period under the grant that has been renewed or replaced.

The Recipient must complete the attached "Indirect Cost Rate Schedule" and return it to HUD with this Agreement. The Recipient must provide HUD with a revised schedule when any change is made to the rate(s) included in the schedule. The schedule and any revisions HUD receives from the Recipient will be incorporated into and made part of this Agreement, provided that each rate included satisfies the applicable requirements under 2 CFR part 200 (including appendices).

This Agreement shall remain in effect until the earlier of 1) written agreement by the parties; 2) by HUD alone, acting under the authority of 24 CFR 578.107; 3) upon expiration of the budget period and performance period for all projects funded under this Agreement; or 4) upon the expiration of the period of availability of Grant Funds for all projects funded under this Agreement.

HUD notifications to the Recipient shall be to the address of the Recipient as stated in the Recipient's applicant profile in e-snaps. Recipient notifications to HUD shall be to the HUD Field Office executing the Agreement. No right, benefit, or advantage of the Recipient hereunder may be assigned without prior written approval of HUD.

Build America, Buy America Act. The Grantee must comply with the requirements of the Build America, Buy America (BABA) Act, 41 USC 8301 note, and all applicable rules and notices, as may be amended, if applicable to the Grantee's infrastructure project. 
