**PARTIES TO THE AGREEMENT**

This Interagency Agreement is made and entered into by and between the Washington State Recreation and Conservation Office, hereinafter referred to as "RCO," and Pacific County Vegetation Management, hereinafter referred to as "PCVM," pursuant to the authority granted by Chapter 39.34 RCW.

**PURPOSE**

In response to the Governor's January 2022 Emergency Order to address the rapid increase in European green crab population within the PCVM's Sea Pond (LSP) and outer coast areas, PCVM shall produce an alternative analysis study to determine the minimum level of infrastructure change required to achieve the goals for the LSP and reduce the EGK population. Through an agreement with the Washington State Department of Fish and Wildlife (DFW), RCO is responsible for executing interagency agreements with public agencies to aid rapid response to the European green crab (EGC) emergency. These funds provide an additional airboat and crew which will double PCVM's capacity to control and survey the rapidly increasing EGK population in Willapa Bay.

**PERIOD OF PERFORMANCE**

This Agreement shall become effective September 12, 2022 and will expire on June 30, 2023, except as clarified in this term below and/or unless terminated sooner or extended as provided herein.

**STATEMENT OF WORK**

PCVM shall acquire a 2022 American Airboat 18' x 8' AirRanger Edition watercraft and trailer to be fully dedicated to European green crab (EGK) control and monitoring in Willapa Bay. In addition, PCVM will continue to provide collaborative and transparent management of PCVM's eradication effort.

**COMPENSATION**

RCO shall reimburse PCVM an amount not to exceed Ninety-Nine Thousand Three Hundred Twelve and No/100 Dollars (\$99,312.00), including any applicable tax and

indirect costs, for the performance of all things necessary for, or incidental to, the work as set forth in this Agreement.

## **BILLING AND PAYMENT**

RCO shall pay PCVM upon acceptance of aircraft and receipt and approval of a properly completed invoice, which shall be submitted to RCO's representative as designated in the Administration section below.

The invoice shall describe and document, to RCO's satisfaction, itemized equipment costs, tax and indirect costs.

Invoices shall be submitted electronically using PRISM online. Information is available on RCO's [billing webpage](#). Contact RCO at [ebilling@rco.wa.gov](mailto:ebilling@rco.wa.gov) with any questions.

Payment shall be considered timely if made by RCO within thirty (30) calendar days after receipt of the properly completed invoice. Payment shall be sent to the address designated by PCVM.

RCO may, in its sole discretion, terminate the Agreement or withhold payments claimed by PCVM for services rendered if PCVM fails to satisfactorily comply with any term or condition of this Agreement.

## **PERFORMANCE REPORTING**

PCVM shall submit bi-weekly reports using the template in Attachment A to [AIS@dfw.wa.gov](mailto:AIS@dfw.wa.gov) and [InvasiveSpecies@rco.wa.gov](mailto:InvasiveSpecies@rco.wa.gov).

In addition, PCVM must submit one (1) Progress Report and a Final Report using PRISM Online. A training video is available [here](#).

## **DISPUTES**

In the event that a dispute arises under this Agreement, it shall be determined by a Dispute Board in the following manner: Each party to this Agreement shall appoint one member to the Dispute Board. The members so appointed shall jointly appoint an additional member to the Dispute Board. The Dispute Board shall evaluate the facts, Agreement terms, applicable statutes and rules, and make a determination of the dispute. The determination of the Dispute Board shall be final and binding on both parties.

## **SUSPENSION**

The obligation of RCO to manage Agreement terms and make payments is contingent upon the state appropriating state and federal funding each biennium. In the event the state is unable to appropriate such funds by the first day of each new biennium, RCO reserves the right to suspend the Agreement, with ten (10) days written notice, until such time funds are appropriated. Suspension will mean all work related to the Agreement must

cease until such time funds are obligated to RCO and RCO provides notice to continue work.

### **TERMINATION**

Either party may terminate this Agreement upon thirty (30) days written notice to the other party. In the event of termination of this Agreement, the terminating party shall be liable only for performance rendered prior to the effective date of termination.

### **ASSURANCES**

PCVM shall comply with all applicable state, federal and local laws and regulations while performing under this Agreement.

All work must follow integrated pest management practices as directed by the Washington Department of Fish and Wildlife.

### **ORDER OF PRECEDENCE**

In the event of an inconsistency in the terms of this Agreement, or between its terms and any applicable statute or rule, the inconsistency shall be resolved by giving precedence in the following order:

- a. Applicable state and federal statutes, and local laws, rules and regulations
- b. Statement of Work
- c. Attachment B - Proposal
- d. Any other provisions of the Agreement, including materials incorporated by reference.

### **AGREEMENT REPRESENTATIVES**

The following individuals are designated as representatives of the respective parties. The representatives shall be responsible for the administration of this Agreement and for coordinating and monitoring performance under this Agreement. In the event such representatives are changed, the party making the change shall notify the other party.

### ENTIRE AGREEMENT

This Agreement, including referenced exhibits, represents all the terms and conditions agreed upon by the parties. No other statements or representations, written or oral, shall be deemed a part hereof.


### APPROVAL

This Agreement shall be subject to the written approval of RCO's authorized representative and shall not be binding until so approved. The Agreement may be altered, amended, or waived only by a written amendment executed by both parties.

**Protocols for Completing EGC Emergency Measures Status Summary Report**

An EGC Emergency Measures Status Summary Report form is completed to document European green crab (EGC) operational (field) and other management actions that occurred during an Operational Period (OP). Information from this form will be used to complete the ICS Situation Report for activities/accomplishments during the OP and for the Incident Action Plan that outlines actions/activities for the next OP. This document provides instructions on how to complete this form. An OP generally covers a two-week span (starting on a Monday and ending on a Sunday) but can cover a shorter time within that period by changing the time period on the form. Using two calendar weeks conforms best to how EGC operations are generally conducted, and data is reported. This is intended to be a high-level record (NOT a detailed novel) of actions and accomplishments during this period for emergency measures documentation. Transmission of detailed trapping data will still be required on a longer timeline and in a separate process TBD. The form is designed to be completed digitally on your computer (click on check box or in empty box or after box title to begin typing) and then emailed to WDFW at [ais@dfw.wa.gov](mailto:ais@dfw.wa.gov). Use Subject line: EGC EM SSR [Coordination Area] [Date mmddyy] (e.g., "EGC EM SSR Seabeck 062822"). Timely submission of this form is requested within 2 working days (COB Tuesdays) after end of the listed OP date on the form.

Background - The marine and estuarine areas of Washington State are divided into two branches: Salish Sea and Coastal. There are 6 Management Areas within the Salish Sea Branch and 7 within the Coastal Branch. Management Areas are delineated based on WDFW's recreational fishing marine areas (Figure 1).

**Coordination Area:** Record the name of the Coordination Area you are reporting on. Generally, this is a geographic place name that best describes a sub-Management Area (e.g., Drayton Harbor, Seabeck, Willapa National Wildlife Reserve, etc.) or it can be the name of the tribe or group conducting EGC management over a broad coordination area. 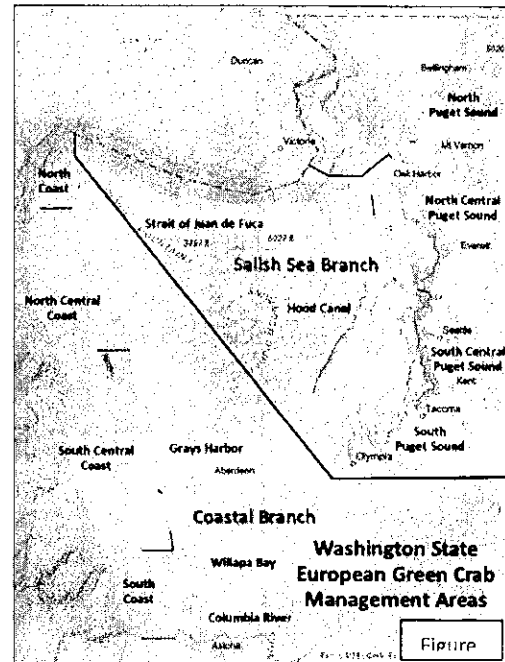
**Rapid response** - means expedited management actions triggered when EGC were first detected in a new area for the time-sensitive purpose of determining scope of invasion and containing or eradicating the species before it spreads or becomes further established.

**Prospecting** – means a form of early detection where a roving crew generally conducts EGC trapping in a selected Coordination Area or single Site using a larger number of traps over 2-3 trap days.

**Control** - means to stop or slow EGC growth in number or size, to prevent the maturation and spread, and/or to reduce the number of a species or the population of EGC in a Coordination Area or Site.

**Research** – means actions implementing an ICS-approved EGC scientific research project.

**Other** (identify) – check box and record any other significant field actions that occurred during this action.



#### **EGC Captures by Coordination Area**

Collection of EGC capture/removal data at specific points in time is critical to assessing emergency measures accomplishments and identifying areas that may require more resources. Record basic EGC capture/removal data (by any means including hand captures) as follows:

**Total Prior:** Record the total number of EGC captured/removed as recorded in WDFW's prior SitRep report. Update the information with an asterisk (\*) if you have a more accurate value.

**Current OP:** Record only the number of EGC captured/removed during this OP (the period noted in "Dates"). If no trapping/removal conducted, put "NT."

#### **Significant Events/Accomplishments**

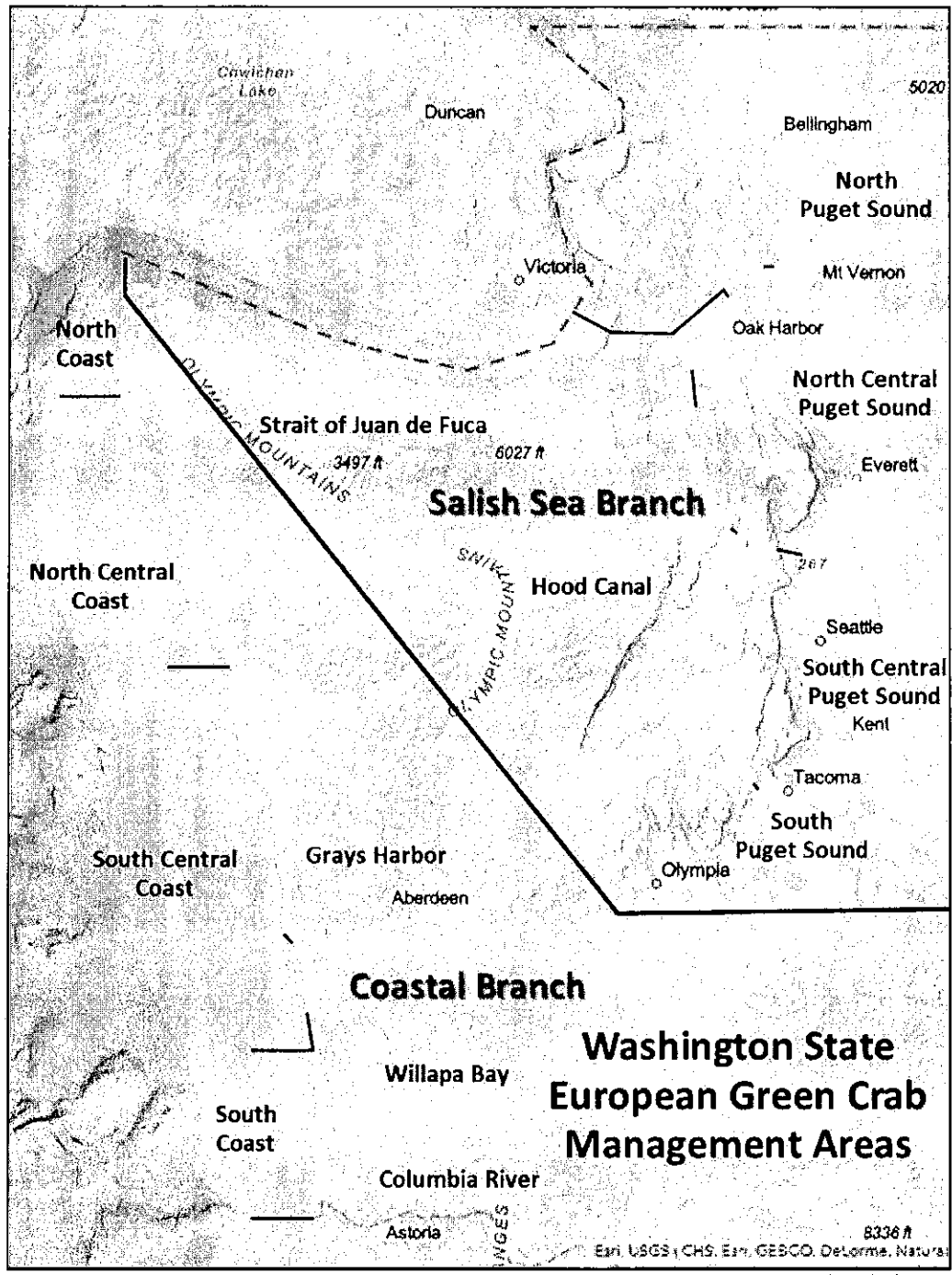

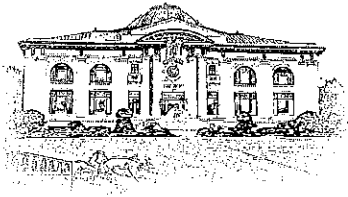

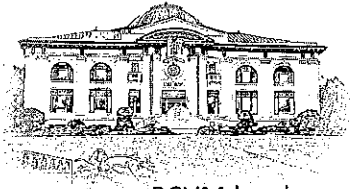

## Project Summary:

PCVM is requesting no more than \$100,000 to acquire an American Airboat 2022 18x8 AirRanger Edition and trailer. This watercraft will be dedicated to European green crab (Egc) control and monitoring in Willapa Bay. PCVM has a similar airboat purchased in 2010 with WSDA funding used for spartina eradication. This airboat is reliable and suited to the conditions experienced in the Willapa Bay tidelands. Other models have not served as well. This airboat will be built to carry as many traps as possible, safely and efficiently.

An unprecedented and unanticipated number of Egc are being trapped in Willapa Bay. To date in 2022, over 50,000 have been removed. They are present wherever traps are set although density varies considerably. Control will be challenging and problematic. Egc start moving to higher tidelands in the spring where access is difficult, similar to the spartina experience. Airboats are necessary for effective and systemic trapping from March through October. Currently we estimate that less than 20% of the Bay is receiving adequate attention. This funding request addresses the situation.



# Pacific County VEGETATION MANAGEMENT

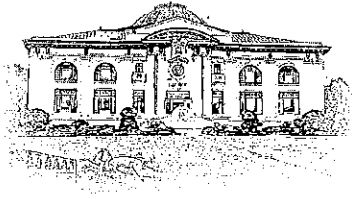
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PCVM has been trapping year around in Willapa Bay since September 2020. We are currently the only entity targeting high density remote areas weekly. (Our definition of high density, or 'hot spots', is a CPUE greater than 10.) We also survey trap to monitor numbers and movement. Our resources are stretched to capacity. Another airboat and crew (which have been identified) would immediately allow us to expand range and remove more green crab from Willapa Bay. From July 25 to August 7, 2022, PCVM captured 2051 Egc in 142 traps.

PCVM has established a close working relationship with the Shoalwater Bay Tribe. We are focused on the North bay to see if a coordinated effort can have an impact on reducing numbers in a defined area. We are local entities working together to try and prevent an ecological disaster.

## Eligible Activities/Qualifications

1. 100% of requested funds will be directed to the European green crab response.
2. This proposal meets the following European green crab (Egc) objectives:
  - An additional airboat and crew will double PCVM's capacity to control and survey the rapidly increasing Egc population in Willapa Bay.
  - PCVM will continue to provide collaborative and transparent management.
  - PCVM is a local entity that has been actively engaged in Egc control and monitoring for two years. (We have been leading the spartina eradication effort for fifteen years.) This funding request to expand delivery serves as another example of our commitment to protect Willapa Bay.
3. Proposed activities are in Willapa Bay.
4. This proposal applies to the South Coast management area.
5. Requested funds will be fully expended by June 30, 2022, probably much sooner than that. There will be no matching funds.
6. This funding opportunity represents the only real avenue for PCVM to acquire a valuable addition to our existing resources.
7. PCVM may request additional funding for a shelter but at this time does not want to divert focus from our primary objective.
8. The acquisition of an American Airboat AirRanger will greatly enhance PCVM's ability to control EGC in Willapa Bay. Our Egc airboat (on loan from the Willapa National Wildlife Refuge) is twenty years old. The hull is patched in numerous places. The new airboat will be built to carry more traps to more remote areas and still be operating in twenty years.
9. PCVM has and will continue to maintain a commitment to reasonable communication, coordination and data management with existing and any reasonable new WDFW requirements including coordination or technical working groups.
10. PCVM considers itself a level 1 emergency funding priority to remedy a critical resource gap affecting the ability to reduce EGC numbers in Willapa Bay.
